BOYS BASKETBALL

Dillon Burns, Xaverian

The C.W. Post-bound guard best known for sharing the ball did his best work putting it in the basket over the weekend. He poured in 24 points in Sunday's 70-42 rout of Holy Trinity (L.I.) and added 18 points and 10 assists in Friday's 64-44 win over Bishop Ford.

Leroy Fludd, Boys & Girls

What a week for the rugged small forward. It began with Fludd putting up 26 points, 15 rebounds and four assists in a dominant 74-56 victory over Transit Tech, continued as he went off for 29 points and 15 rebounds in an 82-65 rout of Robeson and he capped it off with 23 more points in a memorable 64-59 victory over Christ the King.

Steven Gomez, Wings Academy

The versatile 6-foot-7 forward led Wings Academy to a 4-0 week. The highlight was Gomez posting 19 points, 12 rebounds and four blocks in a 56-50 win rival John F. Kennedy. He also had 28 points and 13 rebounds as Wings topped Gompers, 64-50, last Tuesday, and 14 points and six rebounds in an impressive win over Catholic foe Bishop Loughlin on Sunday in the CHSAA-PSAL Challenge.

Kerwin Okoro, St. Raymond

The Iowa State-bound senior swingman didn't just have 17 points to lead St. Ray's in a 62-56 win Friday over Archbishop Stepinac. The 6-foot-5 Okoro locked up star Josh James in the crucial fourth quarter.

Matt O'Neill, St. Edmund Prep

The sharpshooting guard was absolutely on fire Friday night. O'Neill poured in 35 points and drained eight 3-pointers – four in each half – in a 69-59 non-league win over Nazareth.

GIRLS BASKETBALL

Maria Bachman, Cardinal Spellman

It could be the first of many big nights for Maria Bachman. The lanky and athletic sophomore showed plenty of her promise with 26 points – 13 in the first quarter – and 10 rebounds in a win over St. John Villa.

Lashauna Phinazee, John F. Kennedy

The senior forward had the best game of her career Friday in a 68-44 win over Midwood. Phinazee poured in 24 points and grabbed 23 rebounds in a dominant performance.

Fannisha Price, South Shore

Price helped relieve three years of frustration against Murry Bergtraum. She scored seven of her 13 points in the fourth quarter and grabbed 11 rebounds in a win over the Lady Blazers on Friday.

Jenny Ramirez, Lab Museum United

The athletic, Marshall-bound point guard is leading her team to new heights. Ramirez had 26 points and eight assists in a 60-53 win over rival Beacon and Lab Museum United is 6-0 in PSAL Manhattan A West.
